Coordinating Center of Excellence (CCOE) Project	ODMH	07/02 - Current	The Center assisted the Ohio Department of Mental Health in identifying and promoting evidence-based and school-based mental health programs throughout Ohio. The Center provided leadership for the Ohio Mental Health Network for School Success which provides training and technical assistance for school districts and mental health agencies on a regional basis. The Center also provided consultation and assistance to ODMH in developing and implementing Ohio's Access to Better Care (ABC) Initiative. The initiative provides a strategic framework for Ohio's efforts to provide community-based prevention, early intervention and treatment services for children, youth and families with behavioral health disorders and for those at risk of developing such disorders.

The PFS Academy is also assisting a number of counties that have expanded their use of PFS to address broader issues and problems associated with child and family well-being.
